BIP TRANSNATIONAL LITIGATION (MOOT)

3 ECTS

This Blended Intensive Course offers students hands-on experience with international legal cases, helping them understand how international and EU laws interact. Through a moot court simulation, they strengthen their practical skills in jurisdiction, transnational litigation, and Private International Law.

Blended learning activities are a combination of virtual/online learning activities and physical learning activities in the legal field. This study course was created to offer for the students an opportunity to be involved in an international law case and take experience of the complexities of how international Conventions and EU Regulations interact in the context of globalization.

The use of Private International Law or Conflict of Laws leads to the application of different national laws in international cases, allocates jurisdiction and regulates the recognition and enforcement of foreign judgments. This field of law has increasingly come to the foreground of significant multinational legal disputes, where sometimes the entire case hinges on jurisdiction, applicability of certain national regulations or cross-border effects of judgments.

Therefore, it is important to provide students with a combination of both basic and up-to-date knowledge, skills, competences, values and attitudes, enabling them to understand the reasons for selecting the right jurisdiction and how a typical proceeding on transnational litigation unfolds. In the light of the above a moot court competition, simulating a court hearing, offers to the participants an opportunity to analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.
